DRESS REGULATIONS REVISED

Dean Windsor announced to the faculty on Monday, December 2, that the present dress regulations have been abolished and that a new statement concerning dress has been formulated. It is as follows:

"A student's dress and general appearance are considered to be a matter of personal taste; however, courtesy and a concern for the rights of others dictate that they be appropriate to the place and occasion. Students are expected to maintain standards of dress and comportment which are generally acceptable at the College and in the community."

The new statement leaves the matter of dress to student discretion as long as the rights of others in the College community are respected.

LIBRARY REGULATIONS REVISED

The Student Government Association wishes to express its pleasure at the smooth manner in which our requests in a recent open letter to the Administration were handled. Dress regulations were restated in accordance with our wishes, and library hours were extended to conform closely with our original request. The second floor of the library has been reopened for individual study for all CNC students, and an area has been provided on the first floor for group study. It should be pointed out. at this time also that there are many classrooms available for group study at most any given time, and the use of these rooms may be arranged for by contacting Mr. McMurran or his secretary, Mrs. Angevine, in room G-201. A check-out desk will be installed at the exit door of the library, and details for supervision of this desk and the upstairs reading area are being negotiated with members of the library staff and the Library Committee.
