
Hampton on April 15, 1993. He spoke on "Information Strategies for the '90s."

"A Previously Unknown Ordo Prophetarum in a Manuscript Fragment in Zagreb" by Clyde Brockett appears in a collection of essays: Medieval Drama on the Continent of Europe (Kalamazoo: Medieval Institute Publications, 1993). This essay will shortly appear also as an article in Comparative Drama.

A review in <u>Early Drama</u>, <u>Art</u>, <u>and Music Review</u> (15/2, Spring 1993) of Susan Rankin's <u>The Music of the Medieval Liturgical Drama in France and England</u> mentions Brockett's "seminal scholarship" of the 1970s and his continuing work which has helped Dr. Rankin to produce "a masterful summary of our knowledge about medieval music dramas."
