Please support the Colloquia series by attending this talk, and urge your students to do likewise.



Central American Information Week - November 13-20, 1988
Presented by Mary Risacher, R.N.

Please announce to your classes and invite your students to a special presentation by Mary Risacher on the current health and economic situation in Nicaragua.

Mary Risacher is a certified teacher and nurse. She has worked in Matagalpa with the Nicaraguan Department of Health. She trained Nicaraguan health professionals in the teaching techniques necessary for transmitting medical information and skills to the health promoters and midwives who are a vital element in the Nicaraguan health system. In May of 1987, Mary testified in Washington at congressional hearings on the assassination of Benjamin Linder by the contras. She will speak about the health system in today's Nicaragua, and about the effects of the war and the prospects for peace. She has worked with refugees in Honduras and has travelled to El Salvador and Guatemala numerous times. More recently, she has worked with refugees after the hurricane.

We cordially invite you to join your colleagues as we hear this person's perspectives on Transcultural Health Care.

Instruction Evaluation Surveys

Information Systems Planning Committee

The Committee will work with each department to assist in the selection of microcomputer equipment and to provide College-wide training and maintenance for this equipment. The charge of the Committee is as follows:

- . Review and approve all computer and peripheral equipment requisitions for each department
- . Compile and maintain an inventory of all computer equipment on campus
- . Develop a strategy for data communications among all computers on campus
- . Establish guidelines for information systems to support the College's mission in both the short- and long-range.

The Committee members are: the deans, the Assistant to the President, the Director of Computer Services and the Registrar.

The new process of ordering microcomputer equipment will be available and communicated to the College community. The Committee is looking forward to a broad integration of this technology into instruction, research and administration of the College.

A draft of the CNC microcomputer policies will be circulated among the College community. The ISPC welcomes all comments and input to the planning of this vital information resource.
