## SGA NEWS

New Committee Formed - The SGA has authorized the formation of a new committee which shall henceforth be known as the Ring Committee. As the name obviously implies, the primary function of this committee will be the screening from the various types, styles, and designs of rings available a limited number of rings and designs from which the student body will choose an official school ring design.

In addition to the business of school rings, the Ring Committee is also responsible for the adoption of an official school Alma Mater which will also be voted upon by the student body. The adoption of the Alma Mater will be done by means of a contest with an as yet undetermined prize going to the student who submits the best Alma Mater. The official CNC school colors are royal blue and silver grey, which have come to be liberally interpreted as blue and white. These colors were voted upon and adopted by the student body in the early years of the College.

The official CNC emblem is the design of the lamp of knowledge superimposed on an outline map of Virginia, both of which are superimposed on a crest and enclosed in a double line circle with the inscription, Christopher Newport College - The College of William and Mary, within the circle. However, this design will be changed in the near future due to our evolving into a four-year college.

As part of the effort to publicize Christopher Newport College and its activities throughout the Newport News-Hampton communities, several CNC instructors have appeared on WAVY TV's "This Afternoon," a program moderated by Dick Lamb. Withdrawal Date Extended: The date to withdraw from the College without grade notation WP or WF has been extended to Friday, April 11, 1969. This extension of time will give students more opportunity to speak to both advisers and instructors about mid-semester grades. Forms for withdrawal are available in the Office of the Registrar. No withdrawal is official unless made through this office.

Notice of Future Plans: If you have not returned the form indicating your plans for next fall, please do so at once.

Summer School Elsewhere: Any student planning to attend summer school elsewhere must receive permission in advance from the Dean of the Faculty if the student wishes to apply that credit toward the degree at CNC. The request for such permission should be submitted on a form available from the Office of the Registrar.

Spring Vacation: Spring break begins at 5:00 p.m., Tuesday, April 1, and classes will resume at 8:00 a.m., April 9. There will be no evening classes on Tuesday, April 1, but there will be classes in the evening on Tuesday, April 8.

Mid-semester Grades: Grade reports will be mailed to students by Tuesday, April 1. Please do not call this office to ask for grades.

Statistics for Second Semester: The official figures for enrollment were sent to the State Council last week. There are 1044 students enrolled in day and evening classes for the current semester. 534 are enrolled in day school and 510 are enrolled in evening classes. The breakdown according to class is as follows: freshmen - 279, sophomores - 177, juniors - 49. Of the total enrolled, 604 are men and 440 are women.
