## MEN'S HONOR COUNCIL

The Men's Honor Council is composed of four sophomore representatives and three freshman representatives elected by vote of the student body. It is their duty to act on any offense committed by a male member of the student body.

The responsibility of honor is not only in the hands of the Honor Council, but in every student. Under the honor system of Christopher Newport College every student is expected to develop and maintain his own integrity. The purpose of the honor system is to create an atmosphere that enables honor to grow in the student. The success of the honor council rests in the strength of each individual.

Infractions of the Honor Code include cheating, stealing, lying, and failure to report an offense. Whenever a student is accused of a breach of this code, the Honor Council has the right to investigate and if necessary conduct an honor trial. A violation of the Honor Code is punishable by dismissal from the college, but the penalty may be modified if the council finds reasons conclusive for doing such.
