




#### THE TIMES THEY ARE A-CHANGIN'

The Trident staff takes pride in dedicating its second volume to Mr. ROBERT M. USRY, assistant professor of history.





#### MEN'S HONOR COUNCIL

The Men's Honor Council is composed of four sophomore representitives and three freshman representitives elected by vote of the student body. It is their duty to act on any offense committed by a male member of the student body.

The responsibility of honor is not only in the handsof the Honor Council, but in every student. Under the honor system of Christopher Newport College every student is expected to develop and maintain his own integrity. The purpose of the honor system is to create an atmosphere that enables honor to grow in the student. The success of the honor council rests in the strength of each individual.

Infractions of the Honor Code include cheating, stealing, lying, and failure to report an offense. Whenever a student is accused of a breach of this code, the Honor Council has the right to investigate and if necessary conduct an honor trial. A violation of the Honor Code is punishable by dismissal from the college, but the penalty may be modified if the council finds reasons conclusive for doing such.



Four years ago the CHRIS's CRIER, a three page mimeographed newspaper, appeared as the first newspaper published by Christopher Newport College. It was the result of a few student's hard work. From that effort there has evolved the present CAPTAIN'S LOG.

Besides the name change many other improvements have been made during the past four years. No longer is the paper mimeographed, but it is sent to a professional printer. It has increased from three pages to four and, in some instances, to a six or eight page production. The staff has set up an exchange program with area high schools and colleges across the nation. Encouraged by their success, the staff continues to make improvements in the content and publication of the newspaper.
