During the decade it has existed, the Honors Program has grown from ten to seventy students. Whereas it was once difficult to find and keep ten Honor Scholars a year, we now admit thirty or more Honor Students, and enough of them excel that the standards for retaining scholarships have been raised from 3.00 to 3.30.

With 1990 allotments making it possible to award no more than \$500/student, except the Beamer Scholars, the Honors Council may soon be unable to maintain the scholarship program at its present level, let alone adjust for rising tuition.

So, on behalf of the Honors Program, I ask that you consider designating your gift to the Fund Drive to Honors Scholarships and sustain the College's move toward excellence.
