Means of Egress

On several safety inspections of campus buildings, equipment, furniture, etc., have been found placed in hallways, which are safety violations.

"Means of egress shall be continuously maintained free of all obstructions or impediments to full instant use in case of fire or other emergencies. No furnishings, decorations, or other objects shall be placed as to obstruct exits, access thereto, egress therefrom, or visibility thereof." Cf. Virginia Occupational Safety and Health Standards, sections 1910.37 (K) (2) and 1910.37 (1) (1).

On Monday night, February 25, 1985, an employee injured his knee when he turned a corner on the second floor of the Science Building and walked into a chair sitting in the hallway. He will be out of work for two weeks.

Although the employee will be compensated for his medical bills and time lost from work, the accident was preventable, it inconvenienced the employee, and it adds to the cost of College's insurance premium.

All departments are requested to remove all equipment, furniture, etc., placed in hallways or foyers in their areas of responsibility.

The initial meeting of the Committee was held Wednesday afternoon, February 20th. Dr. Summerville made a brief appearance to more fully outline to the members its charge. The committee adjourned after deciding upon the following:

- . to conduct a fair nation-wide search from which to develop a pool of qualified dean candidates.
- . to set April 15th as the last day to receive applications.
- . to advertise in a broad and specific distribution of local and national media.
- . to follow a calendar of steps leading to the mid to late summer recommendation of 3 candidates to the VPAA for final selection.
