

Relocation of College Property

The removal of College property from its assigned location should be documented in writing. Permanent or long term equipment relocation to another department should be accompanied by a completed Equipment Relocation form. Short term property relocation should be documented in memorandum format with the department chairman's signature. Removal of equipment to an off-campus location should be documented by either a memorandum or by completing the appropriate FAACS form. Financial and Administrative Services Bulletin Number: 16-1, entitled Loose Equipment and FAACS Operating Guidelines, provides further instructions and sample forms on the management and relocation of equipment.

<u>Dr. Sang O. Park</u>, representing the School of Business and Economics of Christopher Newport College, attended the Commonwealth of Virginia Seminar on East Asia: China, Japan, and Korea. The seminar was held August 1-13, 1988, and was cosponsored by The College of William and Mary and the Governor's Office. The seminar was designed to build an understanding of East Asian cultures and to disseminate that knowledge to communities throughout the Commonwealth. <u>Dr. Park</u> was a participant in the culminating session on "The Future of Korean
