## NOTICE OF PROGRAM AVAILABILITY, GRANTS OFFICE --

- \* <u>Kellogg National Fellowship Programs (KNFP)</u> awards for group XIV for professionals who are in the early years of their careers and wish to broaden their social and intellectual sensitivity, awareness, and leadership potential. Fellowships are <u>not</u> awarded to assist in obtaining a degree. This is a three year fellowship sponsored by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation. Due date for submission in the current year is December 15, 1993.
- \* University-Industry Postdoctoral Research Associateships in the Mathematical Sciences for persons who recently received their Ph.D. and are interested in pursuing research opportunities in the field of mathematical science. Under this program, recent doctoral recipients receive awards that permit them to choose research environments that will have maximal impact on their future scientific development. It will also broaden their knowledge, experience, and perspectives. Applicants must have not held their Ph.D. longer than 5 years and must not have held any NSF postdoctoral fellowship. This program is sponsored by the National Science Foundation. Due date for submission in the current year is December 13, 1993.
- \* Ford Foundation Postdoctoral Fellowships for Minorities for persons now holding a Ph.D. or who will receive their Ph.D. before January 7, 1994. Awards will be made in the fields of science, humanities, engineering, and mathematics. This program is sponsored by the Ford Foundation through the National Research Council. Due date for submission in the current year is January 7, 1994.
- \* Rockefeller Foundation Humanities Fellowships for persons not now holding a Ph.D. or have received their Ph.D. Awards will be made in various fields. This program is sponsored by the Rockefeller Foundation. Due dates for submission in the current year vary.

## Request for Proposals

The Virginia Department of Education is seeking proposals from college and university faculty to conduct research to include, but not be limited to:

- investigation of the effects of various K-12 educational programs (e.g., parental involvement, grouping practices, use of technology, assessment, and equity) on student achievement,
- identification of strategies for communicating the results of educational research to educators in the field or to enhance communication between and among professionals and parents, and/or
- identification of ways in which the efficiency of educational programs can be increased.

Faculty at Virginia's four-year, state-supported universities and colleges are eligible to submit proposals. Collaboration with K-12 public educators is encouraged. The average award for projects is expected not to exceed \$30,000.

KOPS BOWL FOR KIDS' SAKE is a special version of Bowl for Kids' Sake, a bowling fund-raiser activity conducted by Big Brothers/Big Sisters of America to help high risk children. The agency matches carefully screened adult volunteers ("BIG" Brothers and "BIG" Sisters) with boys and girls ("Little" Brothers and "Little Sisters") from single parent families who have been referred by parents, school, and social service agencies. These young people have been identified as having problems which make them more likely to experience trouble in school, develop drug abuse problems, and/or become delinquent. Many have been abused and more than two-thirds live at or below the poverty level. There are currently 200 plus kids on the Peninsula waiting list in need of help. This event will bring teams together from law enforcement agencies of cities served Big Brothers and Big Sisters of the Peninsula, Inc.

YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE A KOP OR PRO BOWLER to participate. Everyone is invited. Whether you're a non-bowler who can't quite reach 100, a casual bowler, or a pro, your participation helps the agency. We will even help along the way, by raising all scores below 100 to 100. The idea is to get involved and get others involved. KOPS Bowl For Kids's Sake is fun and it's for a great cause...kids.

HOW DOES KOPS BOWL FOR KIDS' SAKE WORK? Glad you asked! Everyone who signs up for KOPS Bowl For Kids Sake gets a sponsor sheet. Then it's just a matter of getting sponsors.
