The Department of Education, Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education announces the 1990 DRUG PREVENTION PROGRAMS IN HIGHER EDUCATION. The Institution-Wide Competition focuses on assisting institutions of higher education to institutionalize their own comprehensive drug and alcohol prevention program. The National College Student Organization Network Competition focuses on assisting college student organizations that wish to work on drug and alcohol prevention. The Approaches to Accountability in Prevention Competition focuses on the formulation of scholarly thought on institutional leadership and individual responsibility in relation to educational problems associated with drug and alcohol use in higher education.
