

Symbol of The Trident

In the myths of the ancient world of Greece and Rome, the students of Christopher Newport College have sought their symbol: the trident of the sea-god, Neptune. With his three-pronged spear, Neptune stirred up the elements of the earth and the sky and water. He girdled the earth, shaped new continents, struck with the force of lightning, and he could subdue the tempests of the natural world. We accept the trident as an instrument of power and as a spur of the spirit. With courage among us, such an instrument can wield an irresistible force, the strength that comes from the entertwining of purpose with knowledge with humility.

The times were adventurous and dangerous. Elizabeth was queen, and England stood poised against her brilliant enemy: Spain. Each country was rising to the zenith of aspirations to the wealth and power to be won in the New World. The seas, both close to the shores of England and Spain and far away in the Atlantic, became inevitably their battlefield. A man could both serve his country and win his glory best at sea in those times. Into this era of England's great sea captains - Gilbert, Hawkins, Drake, and Raleigh - stepped Christopher Newport. From uncertain origins, he won his first fame under Sir Francis Drake in the fierce expedition against Cadiz in 1587.

Admiralty records reveal that Newport took part in the final crushing attack of the English against the Spanish Armada in 1588. From this moment, Newport's colorful career was a succession of commands in expeditions making solid the ascendancy of England. Commanding his first ship, the LITTLE JOHN, Newport took part in England's expedition to the West Indies in 1590. It was here, presumably, that he lost part of his right arm. On his return, he was greeted by the victors and praised by the Queen for his fine qualities of leadership, for his dependability, loyalty, and courage. He became known as "the one-armed Englishman who struck with the suddenness of a tropical storm . . . and treated his prisoners with kindness."*

His last assignment as the "Queen's privateer" was the command of a fleet of ships raiding a number of Spanish ports in the Caribbean Sea. Destroying the Spanish fleet, he returned to England aboard his flag ship, the GOLDEN DRAGON, in great personal triumph. For a while he sought retirement as a gentleman in his beautiful home on Tower Hill near London. After peace

with Spain, trading companies were rapidly developed for the exploration and colonization of the New World.

In 1606, Captain Newport was asked to take colonists to Virginia. They landed at a point which they designated as Newport's News, and settled at Jamestown on May 17, 1607. Before returning to England, Newport established a supply station for the colonists at Point Comfort.


On his second voyage, Newport led an exploration up the James and the York rivers, making invaluable maps along the way. On his return to England, his SEA ADVENTURE was wrecked in a terrible storm off Bermuda. Accounts of this adventure, later received in England, contributed much to Shakespeare's conception of the TEMPEST, played before King James I the winter after Newport's return.

Two other voyages to Jamestown were made in 1610 and 1611, bringing supplies, reinforcements, mail, and above all, people to Jamestown. Captain Newport's flag, sighted from the colony as his ship approached, indeed embodied the lifeline for the weak settlement, the palpable line between the Old and the New Worlds.

In 1617 aboard his ship sailing to the East Indies, Captain Christopher Newport died. Draped in the flag of England, he was buried in the sea which had seen his star rise.

"Courteous to his enemies, loyal to his superiors . . . his justice was tempered with humanity."* Christopher Newport had achieved the enduring title, "The Admiral of Virginia."




Dedication
