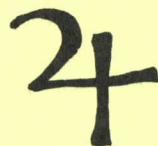

Professor Larry Sacks, famous star of stage and TV screen, will present the fourth lecture in the Applied Math Symposium. The title of his talk is "Are Math and Thermo then at Strife?" Certain postulates of classical thermodynamics are inconsistent with logic and/or math. Since thermodynamics is now being used to explain everything from the energy crisis to the "root pressure", any inconsistencies can have significant effects. The philosophical, instructional and applicational implications of this discrepancy form the basis for a multi-dimensional consideration that will thrill both scientist and non-scientist as well.

Due to the gravity of the lecture, Professor Larry Sacks (or Dr. Sacks as he is affectionately known) will neither sing nor dance.
