The College Handbook Committee has written a draft of the first three sections of the proposed College Handbook. These sections are:

Part I. General Information

This part includes: History, Purpose, Accreditation and Affiliation, Board of Visitors' By-Laws.

Part II. College Administration

This part includes an organizational chart and brief descriptions of administrative offices.

Part III. Participation in College Governance

This part includes sections on Faculty, Students, Auxiliary Positions,

Standing Committees, and Individual Faculty Member.

The next two sections are being organized from existing documents. As needed these will be revised primarily through the use of taskforces.

Part IV. College Policies

This part will include the Board approved policies of the College such as Affirmative Action, Academic Policies, Personnel Policies, Student Life Policies.

Part V. College Services and Facilities

This part will be an informational section on the use of College services and facilities.

The Handbook Committee has disseminated drafts of Parts I, II, and III to the President, Vice Presidents, Deans of the Schools, FAC, and the SA executive council for comments and recommendations.

The Handbook Committee will work with the FAC in developing any motions which require Faculty action. For example, with respect to Part III, the significant changes relative to the Faculty By-Laws will be presented to the Faculty
