MEN'S PHYSICAL FITNESS RESULTS

In achieving a 685 score for the fourth straight time, Donald had the following results: Pull-ups - 15 (97 points), Sit-ups - 100 (100 points), Standing broad jump - 9'3" (99 points), Shuttle run - 8.4 (99 points), 50-yard dash - 5.8 (98 points), Softball throw - 260' (97 points), and 600-yard run - 1:36 (95 points).

The school record is 690 points done by Rupert Whatley in May, 1968.

FROM THE REGISTRAR

Statistics - We had our largest summer school enrollment this year, with 629 students enrolled in thirty courses. There were 323 Christopher Newport students in attendance as well as 199 transfers and 107 new students.

Our fall enrollment seems to have settled down to 1116 in both day and evening classes. We have 561 enrolled in the day school and 555 in the evening college. Once again, the men outnumber the women. There are 283 men and 278 women in the day school. About 74% of the day students are full-time.

Registration - By one o'clock on the day of registration, we had registered more than 500 students. The new system seems to have worked very well, and I felt that there was a minimum of confusion. Any suggestions that anyone has to make will be appreciated since our aim is to have this process of registration conducted as efficiently as possible.

Change of Address - Please notify my office immediately when you change your address or phone number. You may not receive necessary information and grades if we do not have your current address.

Social Security Numbers - If you have no social security number, you should apply for one immediately at the local social security office. It is necessary that we have this number for every student.
