

Carl M. Colonna has had a series of critiques of articles accepted for publication by ABT Books, Inc. The approximate publishing date is June 1980 under the book title of "Economics of Arts Policy." In addition, Carl, in cooperation with the Center for Urban Studies at Akron, has had a monograph accepted for publication by the Charles F. Kettering Foundation. His monograph is entitled, "Arts and Urban Development."

Chung-Wu Chang has been selected to participate in the NEH Summer seminar on Post-Passonian Sociology at Duke, June 16-August 8. He will also present a paper, "The Effects of Agarian Reforms on Taiwan Rural Community Structure," at 5th World Congress of Rural Sociology, August 7-12, Mexico City.
