#### Faculty Advisory Committee

Report of the Student Affairs Subcommittee of the Board of Visitors Thursday, April 28, 1983.

The students reported that they have coordinated with the Vice President for Student Affairs to produce an up-dated version of the document containing the rights and responsibilities of students. It was also reported that Spring Fest was rained out.

Kathy Martin's term as President of the Student Association is drawing to an end, and all present congratulated her and fellow officers on their productive year in office.

The Vice President for Student Affairs reported some success in arranging an insurance (health and accident) program to be made available to CNC students.
