

We all knew Bill as a scholar, a true gentleman, a dedicated teacher, a friend, and a man with a driving desire to strengthen the academic and cultural awareness of students and faculty alike. His dedication to the best in all things, his humanism, his loyalty and his kindness will continue to be an inspiration and an example for us.
