Opportunities Abroad for Teachers, Academic Year 1982-83

Opportunities to teach abroad and to attend seminars abroad are available under the Fulbright Teacher Exchange program of the U.S. Department of Education for the 1982-83 year.

Elementary and secondary school teachers, college instructors and assistant professors are eligible to participate in the academic year abroad teacher exchange program. Exchanges are currently conducted with the United Kingdom, Germany, France, Switzerland, Denmark, Canada, and New Zealand. Basic requirements are: U.S. citizenship, a bachelor's degree, and three years of teaching experience for one-year positions. As most of the positions are on an interchange basis, applicants must be employed currently.

Seminars will also be held in 1982. Those eligible to apply include teachers of the classics, German, Italian, and world, Asian or Middle Eastern history and area studies, social studies supervisors, curriculum directors, teacher educators, and school administrators responsible for curriculum development. Basic requirements are: U.S. citizenship, a bachelor's degree, and two years of teaching experience.

Applications are due between September 1 and November 1, 1981. All programs are subject, of course, to the availability of Congressional appropriations.

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Articulation Committee Report

At the request of the Articulation Committee, Bob Netter and Shahram Amiri have conducted a small study of the success patterns of Virginia community college students at CNC. The following information, drawn primarily from the May 1980 CNC graduating class, is provided for all concerned:

1. Of forty students studied (20 CNC natives, 20 community college transfers), the four highest graduating grade point averages belonged to transfers.
2. Twelve transfers graduated with G.P.A.'s above 3.0; seven natives graduated with G.P.A.'s above 3.0.
3. The five top transfer graduates had majored, in descending order, in: (1) accounting, (2) biology, (3) elementary education, (4) political science, and (5) management.
4. Average grade point averages for the group studied are summarized as follows:

CNC Natives	2.85	2.96
C.C. Transfers	3.03	3.10

5. Of the last 18 President's Award for Achievement recipients, 6 went to community college transfers, 5 to transfers from other four-year schools, and the balance CNC natives.
