Status Report: Six Year Curricular Plan

At next Tuesday's meeting of the State Council of Higher Education, the staff's recommendations on the proposed new degree programs will become public information. Advance information indicates that the following recommendations will be made concerning the new degree programs proposed by CNC:

American Studies:	Encourage development of a full proposal for initiation in August, 1982
Accounting:	Approve for initiation in August, 1980
Computer Science:	Encourage development of a full proposal for initiation in August, 1982
Physical Education:	Deny, unless submitted as a cooperative program.
Music:	Not encourage, because of the limited market for graduates.
Radiological Science:	Not encourage, need will be met by new VCU program.

Religious Studies:	Not encourage, several similar existing programs are experiencing problems in productivity.
Physics:	Encourage development of a full proposal for August, 1982 initiation
Earth Sciences:	Encourage development of a full proposal for August, 1982 initiation provided student demand and job market are examined first.
Community Development & Manpower Planning:	Encourage development of a full proposal for August, 1983 initiation
Geography:	Encourage development of a full proposal for August, 1984 initiation
Humanistic Studies:	Approve for initiation in August, 1981
Occupational Safety Management:	Approve for August, 1980 initiation as a cooperative program with Norfolk State College
Environmental Science:	Not encourage due to the uncertain future for graduates of B.S. Environmental Science programs.

With regard to the proposed masters degrees in Banking and Finance and Policy Studies the Staff recommends that CNC not be encouraged to develop full proposals due to the number of similar graduate-level programs offered in the Tidewater area.

As you know, services by a student regularly enrolled and attending classes in the employ of his school are excluded from social security withholding tax. However, this exclusion applies only during periods of regular school attendance. In order to comply with the exclusion, we have designed a new time sheet to be used for students. We will start using the new green time sheet for time worked in February. These are to be turned in on the first of each following month thereafter. The new time sheets are available in the Payroll Office. It will be the responsibility of the Supervisor or Department Chairman to certify that the student is regularly attending classes. REMEMBER--BEGINNING FEBRUARY 1, 1979, YOU MUST START USING THE GREEN TIME SHEET AND IT MUST BE PROPERLY SIGNED BEFORE TURNING IT IN TO THE PAYROLL OFFICE ON MARCH 1, 1979. PLEASE, NO EXCEPTIONS.
