NOTICE OF GRANTS AVAILABILITY: The Grants Development Office has received notice of the following programs:

Dwight D. Eisenhower Mathematics and Science Education Act, a grant program being sponsored by the State Council of Higher Education: The Eisenhower Act supports initiatives to improve the skills of teachers and instruction in mathematics and science through pre-service and in-service education and through retraining programs. The Grants office would be pleased to provide interested parties with a copy of the request for proposals and a listing of the kinds of programs and institutions which have previously received grants under this program. SCHEV has planned a workshop for all persons interested in submitting proposals from 9:30-12:30 on Thursday November 9, 1989, at the James Monroe Building in Richmond. Proposals should

be prepared and submitted to the College's grants office not later than Monday, December 4, 1989 to allow time for internal processing and coordination.

The W. K. Kellogg Foundation, 1990 Kellogg National Fellowship Program has announced the availability of three year fellowships amounting to up to \$35,000 for the purpose of carrying out a non-degree, self-directed learning plan. The program is designed to prepare leaders who can function effectively and knowledgeably in dealing with complex problems where narrow expertise is not sufficient. Applicants must be nominated by their employing organization or institution. Since the deadline for submission of applications is December 15, 1989, interested parties should complete preliminary development of the application by December 1, 1989 to allow sufficient time for internal coordination as necessary. Dick Guthrie served as French interpreter for the descendants of the Admiral de Rochambeau's family and for the mayor of Vendôme -- the city of his birth -- during their visit to Yorktown in honor of Yorktown Day, Monday, October 16.

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Captain Dewey F. Patrick, Assistant Professor of Military Science completed the Combined Arms and Service Staff School (CAS 3) on 6 October 1989. U.S. Army officers are required to attend this course between their sixth and ninth year of military service. This course teaches what military staff missions are by defining and tracing the

development of military staffs and staff roles; teaches what staffs do by training students in common and collective military staff procedures; and teaches how the military staff performs its mission by requiring students to apply acquired skills and knowledge in responding to situations in simulated garrison and tactical environments.

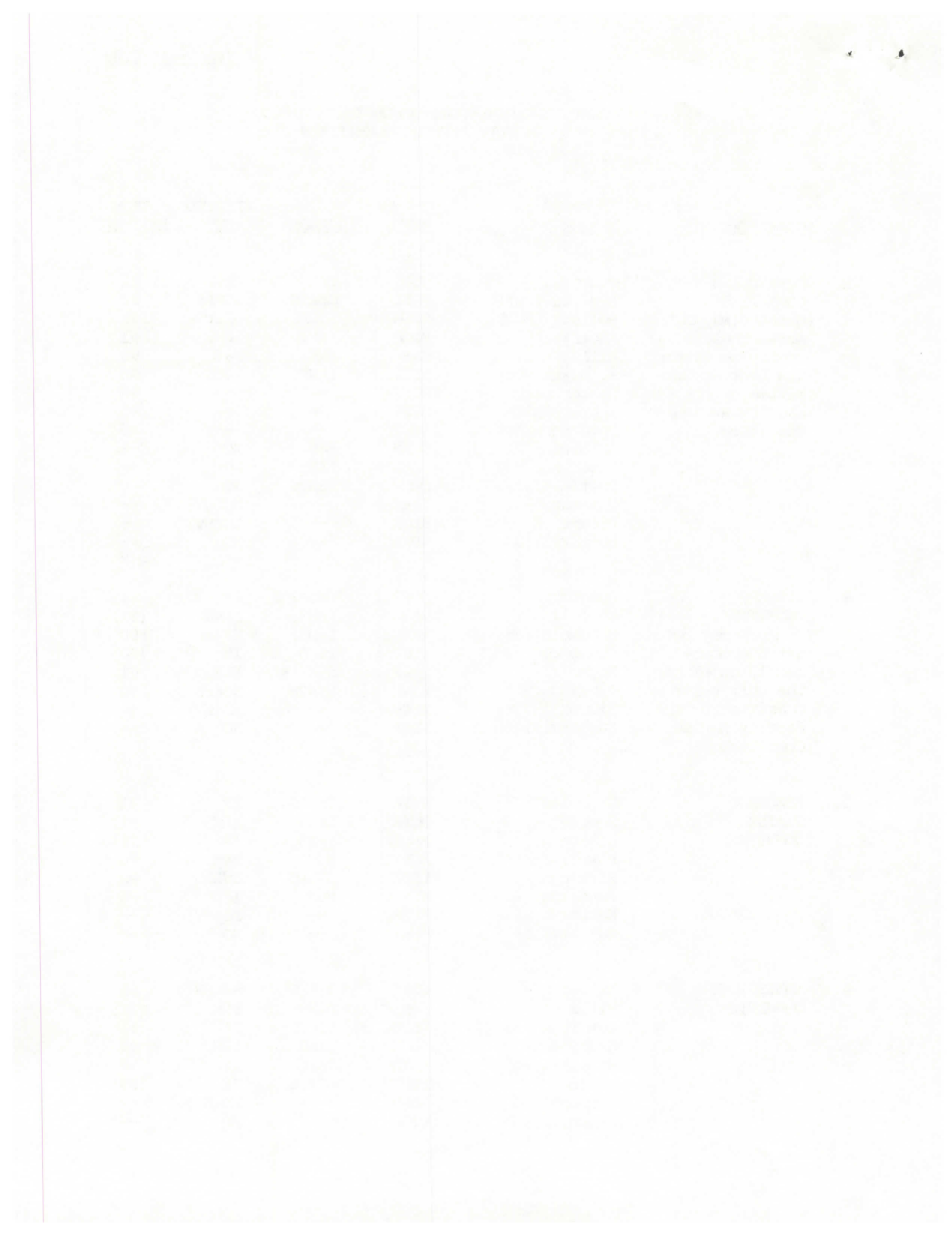
