Two CNC students, Donald Hukle and Owen Costello, were awarded student honors at the Virginia Social Science Association meetings, in Richmond. The meetings were well attended, and CNC students competed with entries from universities and colleges throughout Virginia. The topic of their presentations stemmed from Political Geography courses taught at CNC concerning Diego Garcia, the strategic Coral island in the Indian Ocean. Mr. Costello presented a site and situation study with maps and visual aids. Mr. Hukle gave an analysis of political, strategic and geographic implications concerning America's role in the vital Indian Ocean area. The student session was held in conjunction with the meeting of the Virginia Social Science Association on 12 April 1975. These meetings were held on April 11 and 12.
