Federal Employment Seminar

The Office of Counseling and Career Services will be sponsoring an informational workshop on obtaining employment with the federal government on Wednesday, March 27, 1985, at 1:30 p.m. Ms. Sarah Sweatt, Staffing Specialist from the Norfolk Office of Personnel Management, will be the featured speaker for this long-awaited seminar.

Topics of interest will include an overview of the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) and the Federal Job Information Center, procedures used by OPM for rating applicants, vacancy announcements, types of appointments, and hiring preferences. Helpful hints concerning exam preparation and how to actually obtain a government job will be covered. Additionally, hands-on experience will be gained for successfully completing the Standard Form 171. A question and answer session will be offered for individuals with specific concerns.

A \$2.00 cash registration fee is required for participation in the Federal Employment Seminar. Early registration is recommended due to limited seating. 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Fellowships in Mathematics and Science Education

Application forms and information concerning the John R. Clark Fellowships in Mathematics and Science Education at Teachers College, Columbia University, are now available in the Counseling and Career Services Office. The recipients of these fellowships will receive tuition assistance while participating in this innovative program to alleviate the current national shortage of qualified instructors of science and mathematics.

College juniors or seniors either majoring or minoring in math, science, computer science, or any science-related field are eligible for Clark Fellowships. Prior coursework in education is not required. Clark Fellows will enroll for courses in the philosophical, historical, and psychological foundations of education, the psychology of learning mathematics and science, and mathematics and science courses not usually offered by undergraduate institutions. Field experience will be combined with traditional classroom work to provide a solid foundation of educational experience.

Clark Fellows will be granted early admission to graduate studies, \$1800 of tuition assistance, placement assistance, access to the facilities of a major university, and the opportunity to study under leading mathematics and science educators.
