Christchurch Meet - CNC lost the track meet held at Christchurch on Feb. 19th. Score: Christchurch - 54 --- Christopher Newport - 46. Burt Seawell won four firsts and one third place for 21 points. Joel lax, in his first competition, won the 12 lb. shot put. Gaylon Ryan had a first in the 2-mile and a second in the one mile.

State Indoor Meet - Three runners represented CNC well on February 8 at Lexington, Virginia. Gaylon Ryan set a school record in the 2-mile run with a time of 10:32. Burt Seawell broke the school record in the triple jump four times, his best being 43'6". This was 6th place in the meet. Greg Donner placed first in the Freshman Division for the 60 yd. high hurdles.
