Approved Minutes of Curriculum Committee Meeting February 5, 1986

Present: Olson (chairman), Barbour, Bostick, Durel, Hooper, Hornback, Hunter, Park, Pellett, Powell, Turner, Weber

The minutes of the meeting of January 29 were approved.

The Committee met with Dr. Hoaglund to explore further the issue of the transfer of PHIL 121, 122, 123, offered by community colleges, to CNC when the new curriculum goes into effect. The problem revolves around two issues: 1) the maintenance of the articulation agreements. This sequence satisfies the Humanities Requirement in the community colleges. Should it therefore satisfy one half of CNC's 12-hour Humanities Requirement? 2) the use of one course sequence to satisfy two requirements. Since the course sequence is a Logic course, should it also satisfy the Critical Thinking requirement for the Letters Degree? (New curriculum: IV, 1, A)

The Committee voted to accept the transfer to CNC of PHIL 121, 122, 123 as PHIL 101 and a lower-level elective, meeting the Critical Thinking component of the Letters Degree requirement but not fulfilling one half of the Humanities Requirement.

The Committee discussed the materials submitted by the English Department concerning ENGL 207-208 and voted to return the proposal to the English Department until a tentative global syllabus is submitted.

Dean Durel informed the Committee of the intent of the Political Science Department to modify its 101, 102 sequence. POLS 101 will be deleted from the catalog. POLS 102 will be renumbered as 201; POLS 221 will become 202. POLS 201-202 will thus constitute the non-global lower-level introductory Political Science course. The new numbers were chosen to avoid the duplication of course numbers and thus preserve the continuity of the data base. The sense of the Committee was approval of the alteration.

Minutes of the CNC Faculty Meeting of Feb. 14, 1986

The meeting was called to order at 3:30 by Dr. Summerville, the presiding officer.

- I. The minutes of the December 6, 1985 and the January 17, 1986, CNC faculty meetings were approved as reported in the Chronicle (#4 of 1986, p. 4).
- II. President Anderson briefed the faculty on efforts being made by members of CNC's administration and faculty to promote the best interests of the College and the community before the Virginia Legislature as it begins consideration of the Governor's budget proposal. He thanked those members of the faculty who have expressed their views to local legislators.

- E. Faculty Advisory Committee
 Dr. Gordon for the FAC mentioned that faculty had until Feb. 26,
 1986, to submit faculty development and release time grant proposals. He also noted that, although the committee had considered
 possible changes in final exam and outside employment policies,
 the committee continued to favor current policies.

- IV. Ms. Royall briefed the faculty on the current status of the institutional self-study and noted that Dr. Douglas Smith, Chairman of the SACS Visitation Committee, will visit the campus on Feb. 17 and 18, 1986, to make preparations for the SACS Visitation Committee visit April 28-May 1, 1986.
- V. The faculty approved the Curriculum Committee's recommendation that Theatre 210-211 be considered a course sequence that meets the "Global View" criteria. The faculty voted to send back to the Curriculum Committee for further consideration its second recommendation that the College continue to accept PHIL 121, 122, 123 (from the community colleges) as transferring in as PHIL 101 plus lower-level electives, which would meet the Letters Degree Requirement but not one-half of the Humanities Requirement.
- VI. The faculty approved the recommendation from the Subcommittee on Commemoratives and Publications of the 25th Anniversary Steering Committee that "At the helm of the future" be the College's motto. The faculty voted to table the motion to approve "We Will Cherith Christopher Newport" as the official College song.
- VII. The faculty approved the recommendation from the Faculty Advisory Committee that the FAC be empowered by the Instructional Faculty to advise the president on matters regarding personnel in the event of a declaration of financial exigency during the current fiscal year.
- VIII. The faculty approved the nine student petitions submitted to the Degrees Committee.
 - IX. Dr. Gordon announced that the Faculty Advisory Committee will communicate with the CNC Board of Visitors concerning the goals and objectives of the College. Dr. Summerville announced that Alpha Chi will be holding its Spring induction of CNC students at 3 p.m. on Feb. 16, 1986. Immediately following the induction will be a piano recital by Glen Winters.
 - X. The meeting adjourned at 4:20.
