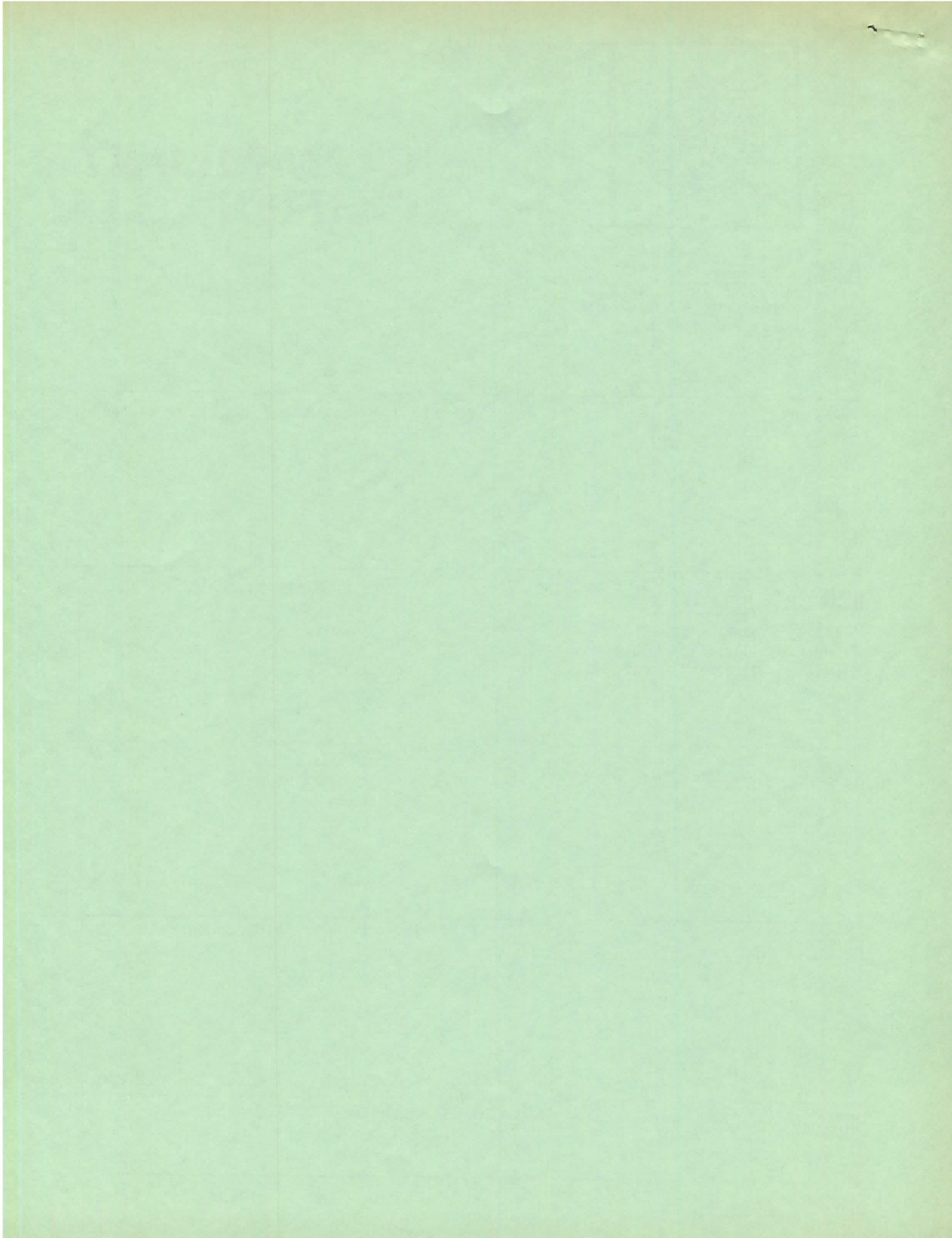

CNC Training Policy Eligibility Defined

For in-house training programs, eligibility includes all personnel including hourly and student employees where there is nominal cost, such as the CPR course and other workshops. For training off campus, such as that offered by OMDT where there is a larger fee plus travel and motel involved in many cases, priorities will be established by the Personnel Director with full-time employees being given first priority. All training is subject to funds being available. This policy is not to be confused with the CNC Tuition Waiver Policy or Educational Aid for State Employees Policy.

Training - CPR Heartsaver and Basic Cardiac Life Support

Arrangements have been made with the Junior League of Hampton Roads and the American Heart Association to conduct a Heartsaver class on campus Monday, February 23, from 6:30 to 10:30 p.m. The Basic Cardiac Life Support Course will be taught on campus Friday, March 6, from 6:30 - 10:30 p.m. and Saturday, March 7 from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Enrollment fees will be paid by the college.

The Heartsaver course (4 hours) teaches only one-man cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) while the Basic Cardiac Life Support course teaches one-man and two-man CPR, resuscitation of infants, and airway obstruction.

The minimum number required for both classes is 10 participants and the maximum number is 20; therefore, enrollment will be on a first-come, first-served basis.
