Community Forum on Aging

On Friday, March 19 from 9 A.M. until 1 P.M. Christopher Newport College will host a Community Forum on Aging. This forum is being sponsored jointly by the CNC Gerontology Program and the Peninsula Agency on Aging and is for all residents on the peninsula who have an interest in aging. The program is designed to appeal to a wide audience, with workshops for Health and Mental Health practitioners, nonhealth practitioners, volunteers, and administrators. Of possible interest to families of CNC students and faculty is a workshop on "Positive Aging" for people nearing retirement. It will deal with preventive health measures, as well as social and financial planning for retirement. Another workshop of interest is one on "You and Your Aging Parent" for adult children in the community who are concerned about their increasingly frail elderly parents. This workshop will try to offer understandings and information that will be helpful.

Resource people for the six workshops will be state and local professionals working in the aging field. CNC faculty members serving as resource people include in addition to Ruth Kernodle, Director of Gerontology who has planned the program, are James Windsor, Sanford Lopater, Cheryl Mathews, Lea Pellett, Gladys Rose and Beth Haynes.

Brochures describing the Forum on Aging in detail and containing a registration form are available at the CNC library, Campus Center desk, and from Ruth Kernodle (599-7114). There is no registration fee for the Forum.
