The English Department invites the entire CNC community to a Poetry Reading by Toi Derricotte on Wednesday, March 29, at 8 p.m. in Christopher's.

A native of Detroit and currently a member of the English Department at Old Dominion University, Ms. Derricotte has published two books of poems--Natural Birth and Empress of the Death House--and won a First Prize in the Academy of American Poets Competition. Her third collection is slated for Fall publication.

Ms. Derricotte attributes the intensity of her work to "a paranoia in the adults of my childhood, a pervasive sense of vulnerability.... Perhaps these were only my own feelings..., but it may also have something to do with the fact that being black in a 'white' world is like having a reasonless and frightening parent...."

Following the reader, which begins the 1989 Writers Series, a reception will be held in Christopher's. There will be no admission charge, and everyone is welcome!
