# Open auditions Valuable scheduled for Fall production

The CNC Theatre will be holding open auditions for Cat On A Hot Tin Roof by Tennessee Williams on Tuesday, September 3 and Wednesday, September 4. Auditions will be held in the Campus Center Theatre at 8 p.m. Five men ranging from early twenties to mid-sixties and three women in the same age range are needed.

Cat On A Hot Tin Roof is one of William's most popular plays. It opened in New York in 1955 and ran for 694 performances. It also brought the playwright his second Pulitzer prize.

The Broadway production, directed by Elia Kazan, included a cast of stars such as Burl Ives, Mildred Dunnock and Barbara

Bel Geddes. The play was also made into a movie starring Elizabeth Taylor and Paul New

Performances at CNC are scheduled for October 25, 26, and November 1 and 2. Four special high school performances are scheduled on October 24, 25, 31 and November 1 at 10 a.m. The high school students will participate in an essay contest in connection with the play. The winning essay will be published in the spring.

The production will be directed by Dr. Bruno Koch. Henry Sparks will design the scenery and lighting, and Gwen Sharoff will design the costumes.




