

As a result of requests for further information on comparative education costs at Virginia public institutions, I am making available the data depicted on September 11, 1981 (Table I).

You will note that my statement about "Room and Board" being added to the "total costs" was incorrect. "Room and Board" was masquerading under the "Auxiliary Enterprise" rubric.

To remedy this, a different analysis has been made (Table II) and is furnished also for your information. The source for these data is also listed.

Dean's Colloquia Series Lecture

The Dean William Parks Memorial Colloquia series will present Dr. William J. Morgan of Washington, D.C. as its first speaker of the year. Dr. Morgan is Senior Historian and Head of the Historical Research Branch of the Naval Historical Center. The author of four books on American naval affairs, Dr. Morgan is best known as the editor of the multi-volume series Naval Documents of the American Revolution.

Taking as his topic the Battle of Yorktown in conjunction with the October Yorktown bicentennial celebration, Dr. Morgan's talk will be entitled "Yorktown: A Naval Victory of Note."

This lecture will take place on Wednesday, October 7, at noon in the Campus Center Theatre. As in past years, a luncheon in the guest's honor will follow in the Campus Center. Faculty members wishing to join Dr. Morgan and the Committee at lunch should forward \$4 to me by Monday, October 5.

Dr. Morgan will also hold an informal seminar in the Board Room at 2:00 to discuss Yorktown, the Revolutionary War, and, if asked, the work carried out at Naval Historical Center.
