Foster Parenting

The Refugee Unaccompanied Minor's Program is a foster care Program designed to resettle youths from other countries in long term foster homes. The program operates under the auspices of Catholic Family and Childrens Services of Richmond, Inc., a licensed child placing agency, and has four regional offices.

The goal of the program is to help refugee adolescents become independent, self-sufficient adults. Our program provides the opportunity for individuals to become actively involved in helping resettle these youths, currently from Southeast Asia and Haiti, in a variety of ways.

Individuals, couples, or families interested in accepting the challenge of foster parenting are asked to provide either long term or short term foster placements. Volunteers are trained to provide individual tutoring in English language skills as well as other subjects. Other volunteers work with the youths or program staff in different ways depending upon their area of interest.
