### Dean's Colloquia Committee

On Wednesday, February 1, the Dean's Colloquia will present Dr. John W. Blassingame of Yale University as a visiting scholar. Professor Blassingame is one of the top black scholars in America and the author of The Slave Community and Black New Orleans, 1860-1880. He was also co-editor of The Autobiographical Writings of Booker T. Washington and has authored or edited three other major works, in addition to a score of articles.

Dr. Blassingame's address to the student body, faculty, and guests from neighboring institutions is entitled "Africa, White Churches and the Evolution of the Slave Family." It will be delivered at 12:00 noon in the Campus Center Theatre.

As usual, we will honor Dr. Blassingame and our guests with a luncheon at 1:00. Dr. Blassingame has also agreed to hold an informal seminar for students and faculty at 2:00 in the Board Room.
