## Student Hork Study Funds

The attention of all department Chairpersons and Office Chiefs is called to a new accounting procedure.

Beginning with the 1976-77 (1976-78 Biennium) fiscal year the 80% portion of the Work Study student wage expense will be charged directly to the departmental or office M & O Budget. The Federal funds to offset the 80% will be deposited with the State Comptroller monthly. In previous years the 80% portion was charged to a separate Work Study account and was thus never reflected in departmental records of expense. This change was directed by the Bureau of the Budget so that departmental costs would be more truly reflected in the record of expenses. This is an accounting procedure and should not change or modify your employment and use of Work Study students.

The 20% portion will be charged as before to the Virginia Scholarship and Loan Assistance for Students fund in the case of departments funded from State General fund monies. However, auxiliary and off campus activities will fund the 20% from their own fund sources.
