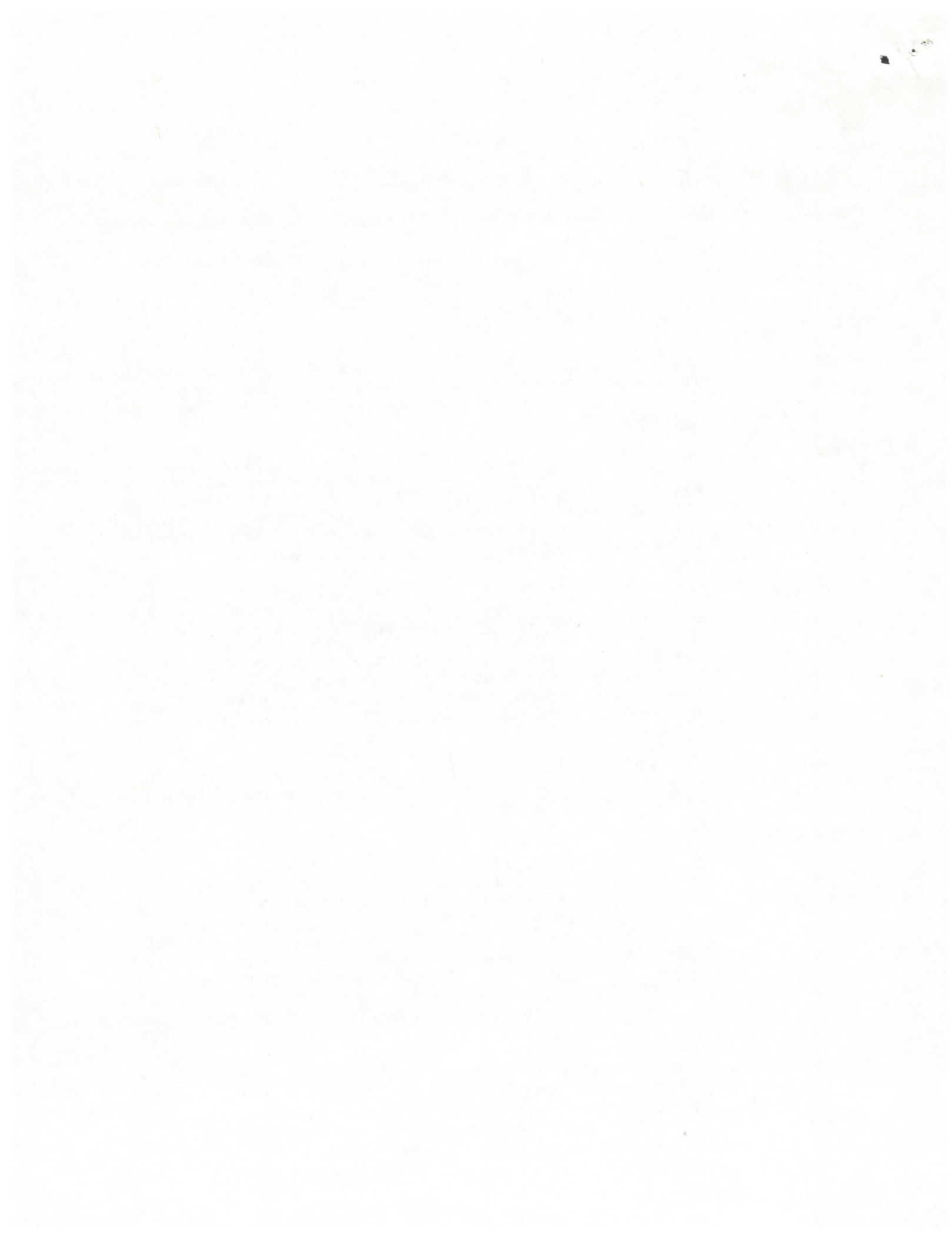

Freshmen interested in becoming Honors Students should submit an application form by Dec. 1. Applications forms are available in the English Dept. McMurran 105.

The Honors Program consists of specially designed courses, usually interdisciplinary, that encourage high degrees of student participation and independent thinking. Honors Students also received registration privileges and become eligible for approximately 40 scholarships. The current CNC catalog (pages 145-148) provides more detail. The Honors Council will screen applicants based on grade point average, and candidates will be accepted as space permits.
