# Personnel Announcement



II. It is hereby moved that the following changes be made in the Catalogue under the section "Changes During the Drop Period" on page 31 of the current revised Catalogue. Changes to take effect Summer 1979.

#### Current Policy

Changes During the Drop Period

No courses may be added after the add/drop period, but courses may be dropped for justifiable reasons.

A "Request to Drop Courses" form must be obtained from the Registrar and signed by the student's adviser and instructor. (For a period of approximately six weeks) (See College Calendar for exact date), a student may drop a course without grade penalty. The notation "Dropped" will

Page 31 under "Changes During the Drop Period," third sentence <u>DELETE</u>
"For a period of approximately six weeks..." and <u>SUBSTITUTE</u> "During the first nine weeks, or its equivalent in a short session..." Also, in the next sentence <u>DELETE</u> "...Dropped"..." and <u>SUBSTITUTE</u> "...W...."

NOTE: This will clarify current operating policy and make course & college withdrawal

be made on the permanent record card. After the drop date, a student may drop a course under these conditions:
(1) if the student is failing the course, he or she may drop it with a grade of F; (2) if the student is passing the course, he or she may drop it without a grade penalty with the permission of the student's adviser and instructor.

No student may drop a course after the last day of classes before the examination period (see the College Calendar

III. It is hereby moved that the second sentence under "Readmission after Withdrawal," found on page 32 of the current revised Catalogue, be stricken.

Readmission after Withdrawal

A student who withdraws may seek readmission for any semester, provided he or she is in good standing, by writing to the Dean of Admissions for an application for readmission.

A student who withdraws with WF in half or more of his or her courses will be considered in the same way as a suspended student and must formally request reinstatement in good standing by the Committee on Academic Status after at least one semester has elapsed.

#### Proposed Policy

Page 32 - under "Readmission after Withdrawal" <u>DELETE</u> entire sentence beginning "A student who withdraws with WF..." as it is not currently practical and will not be appropriate under the proposed grading system which omits the WF grade.

IV. It is hereby moved that the paragraph beginning with "the student who withdraws with WF...," found under "Minimum Standing for Continuance" on page 33&34 of the current revised Catalogue be stricken as inappropriate any longer.

Minimum Standards for Continuance
The student who withdraws with WF in
half or more of his or her courses
will be considered in the same way
as a suspended student. The notation
"may not enroll without permission of
the Committee on Academic Status"
will be placed on his or her permanent record card. A full-time student
who receives an I in half or more of
his or her courses must make up the
incomplete work before registering for
the following semester or must obtain
the permission of the Committee on
Academic Status to re-enroll.

Pages 33-34 - under "Minimum Standards for Continuance" <u>DELETE</u> entire paragraph on p. 34 that reads "The student who withdraws with WF..." as this policy is not considered appropriate.

V. It is hereby moved that a new catagory "Academic Dismissal" be created and be inserted in the Catalogue. This to take effect as of Summer 1979.

# Proposed Policy

Page 35. NEW CATEGORY called Academic Dismissal.

A student who again falls below the minimum academic standards after two suspensions will be academically dismissed. The notation "Academic Dismissal" will be placed on the permanent record card. Students dismissed from Christopher Newport College may, after a minimum of three years, apply for admission to the College. Such persons will be treated as new students and their previous records at Christopher Newport College will be considered as part of the relevant materials for the application to the College.

VI. It is hereby moved that a new category "Medical Withdrawal" be created and be inserted in the Catalogue. This to take effect as of Summer 1979.

Proposed Policy
Medical Withdrawal: A student who wishes to withdraw from the College for medical reasons must have a letter sent to the Registrar by a physician testifying that the student is incapable of completing his academic work due to medical reasons. Upon receipt of that letter all grades for the semester in question will be noted as "W" on the student's transcript.

VII. It is hereby moved that the old "Forgiveness Policy" be officially sanctioned and placed in the Catalogue. Effective Summer 1979.

Proposed Policy
Forgiveness Policy: A student who has not taken any courses at the College for a period of at least three years, may apply to the Registrar, acting for the Academic Status Committee, to have his entire past college record at CNC forgiven. The record of such courses will remain on the student's transcript but it will be noted that these courses have been forgiven. Forgiven courses will not fulfill any academic requirements nor will they be computed in the new GPA.
