The combined forces of the Chemistry Department and the little area known as Physics will present

Dr. Henry V. Morgan, Senior Physicist, Physics Division, Oak Ridge National Laboratory

who will explain and demonstrate the use of the remarkable phenomena known as holography. Dr. Morgan will show how a helium-neon <u>laser</u> is constructed and then how this is used to form a hologram. Some of the many applications of holography will be discussed.
