CPA Exam Results

On November 26 the results of the May 1984 CPA Exam compiled with respect to Virginia colleges and universities were received. Three CNC graduates out of 9 taking the exam for the first time passed all parts for a 33.3% passing rate. Seven CNC graduates out of 12 repeat candidates passed all parts for a 58.3% passing rate. In that the average passing rate is approximately 10% for first time candidates and 30-35% for repeat candidates, the CNC passing rates are noteworthy.
