Peninsula Jewish History Presentation

On February 14, 1984, a presentation of "When Memory Comes.... A Centennial Preview" will be made in Christopher Newport Hall, Room 212, at 7:00 p.m.

The United Jewish Community is now preparing for the 100th anniversary of organized Jewish life on the Virginia Peninsula. In honor of the occasion an oral history is planned for

publication. During the past year a team of volunteers and professional historians have been interviewing Peninsula residents, collecting old photographs, and seeking memorabilia. Together with an introductory essay, these published memories and reproduced photographs will offer an intimate view of Peninsula Jewish life from its early beginnings until the present. This project is being funded by the Virginia Foundation for the Humanities and Public Policy and the American Association for State and Local History.

The February 14th presentation of videotaped interviews and slides of early twentieth century life on the Peninsula will be given by Shomer Zwelling, the Project Director. Rabbi Charles Levi, Adjunct Professor of Religious Studies at Christopher Newport College, will comment on elements of the presentation.

The cost of the trip is \$1,249.00.* This price is based on double occupancy; if anyone prefers a single room, there will be an additional charge. The cost of this trip may be charged partially or in full for a nominal service fee to one of the major credit card accounts.

Included in the price of the trip:

1. Round trip air fare on a regularly scheduled jet from New York's J. F. Kennedy airport.
2. All transfers and portage between hotels and airports in Spain.
3. Lodging in first class hotels in double rooms with private baths.
4. All tours described in the itinerary with English speaking guides.
5. Land transportation in deluxe air conditioned buses.
6. All breakfasts (continental style) and one other meal each day, as indicated in the itinerary.
7. Full medical and surgical insurance while in Spain and Portugal.
8. Flight bags and luggage tags.
