

# Term Paper Consulting Service

Smith Library is initiating a Term Paper Consulting Service which will be offered by the Reference Department to help students through the research stages of writing term papers. A student who signs up for an appointment may expect to spend up to 30 minutes in conference with a librarian. Librarians can serve as teachers/counselors to work with students in helping to define research objectives clearly and develop plans to attain these objectives. Students may learn about reference books which would provide a useful perspective on the subject of the paper, about more efficient ways to use the card catalog, or about library tools which could simplify their research. It may happen that in just talking with a librarian about the topic a student may develop a clearer idea of what he wants to convey in his paper.

As a promotion for this new service the library is sponsoring a contest to name the service. Details will be in the Thursday, February 7th CAPTAIN'S LOG. All faculty, staff and students at Christopher Newport College are invited to participate.
