Virginia Uniform Traffic Summons

On May 1, 1981, the Campus Police Department began utilizing the Virginia Uniform Traffic Summon for moving traffic violations such as Reckless Driving, failure to stop at a stop sign, speeding, driving on the wrong way on a one-way street, etc.

The officer issuing a summons for a traffic violation will set a date and time for the case to be tried in the Newport News General District Court, Traffic Division, 230 - 20th Street, Newport News, Virginia. The violator will have the options of paying the summons before the trial date or appearing in court for trial at the time and date shown on the summons. Failure to appear when scheduled constitutes a separate offense.

The final disposition of the case rests with the court and is a matter over which the officer issuing the summons nor the Campus Police Department has any control.

Everyone is expected to exercise safe driving practices and to obey traffic regulations on campus as well as off campus, thereby eliminating Campus Police Officers having to issue traffic summons and you having to contribute your valuable time and money to the court, attorneys, etc.

Cable TV Connection

The Media Department of the library has arranged to have installed a cable connection to the cable television system serving Newport News, Hampton Roads Cablevision.

This company is furnishing through this cable link, at no charge to the College, access to a variety of programming sources, as well as good quality signals. Television programming not normally accessible by regular broadcasting that may be of interest for educational purposes include:

- CNN - Cable News Network - 24 hour news programming.
- ESPN - Eastern Sports Program Network - Sports.
- Nickelodeon - Childrens programs.
- ARTS - Alpha Repertory Television Service Arts Programs.
- U.S.A. Network - various programs including U.S. House of Representatives.

Eventually, it is hoped that the cable connection will include a dedicated cable channel devoted to higher education (THE channel-Tidewater Higher Education channel) carrying such programming as:

- ACSN - Appalachian Community Service Network.
- PTV3 - educational programming for Corporation of Public Broadcasting.

At present we have a one-way capability but this will eventually be made two-way, allowing CNC to feed programming into the cable system(s) serving the whole Tidewater area, both Peninsula and Southside.
