Sishagne also presented another paper at a University of llinois International Symposium on State, Land, and Society in the istory of Sudanic Africa (April 22-24, 1993). His paper was ntitled "Making the Best Out of a Difficult Situation: Some ethods of Accumulation of Land in Northern Ethiopia, Eighteenth to he Early Twentieth Century."

Dr. Sishagne was also interviewed by the African Service of the Voice of America on March 2, April 6, and May 12, 1993. He also participated in a tele-conference interview by the Voice of America on April 15, 1993. African experts from Ethiopia, North America, and Europe participated in the latter interview. This interview was transmitted to Africa in several segments over a three week period.

300,000th BOOK ACQUISITION -- On June 22, the 300,000th book was presented to the Captain John Smith Library at CNU.

CNU faculty member James M. Morris gave his book A History of the  $\underline{\text{U.S. Navy}}$  to President Santoro. The president is now donating the book to the library as the 300,000th acquisition.

While 300,000 may not sound like many books for a library, it is when the age of the school is taken into consideration. The Captain John Smith Library has been open for more than 30 years.

The majority of the acquisitions can be attributed to Library Director Wendell Barbour. In the 10 years he has been working at the library, more than 180,000 books have been acquired.

Barbour is excited about the 300,000th book. He said, "it is wonderful to receive this book as the 300,000th acquisition, especially since it was written by one of our own faculty members." While this book was presented as a gift, most books are purchased. This past year, \$400,000 was used to purchase books. Next year, the library budget is allowing for half a million dollars to purchase books.
