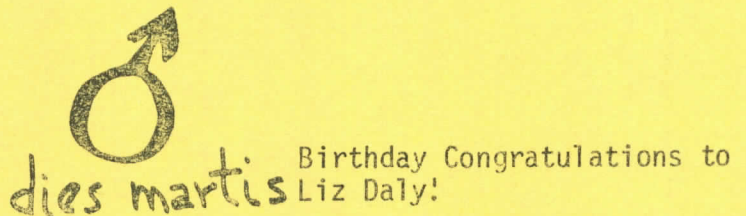

### How to Use Major Medical-----For "Extra" Health Care Benefits

The Major Medical portion of the Commonwealth of Virginia health care program provides supplemental benefits to Blue Cross hospital and Blue Shield physician coverage. Many medical services that are not covered by the Blue Cross and Blue Shield base program are taken care of by Major Medical. Here's how it works:

Every family member enrolled in the program has a \$100 deductible for medical expenses during each calendar year. If you are enrolled under Employee-Dependent coverage, there is a \$300 family maximum, so that once three family members have each satisfied the \$100 deductible, the remaining members are not required to pay a deductible.

As soon as the deductible has been met, additional bills can be submitted to Major Medical, which will pay 80% of the charges. You must complete a claim form, attach all itemized bills (such as for doctors' home and office visits for a specific illness or complaint, prescription drugs, private duty nursing, etc.) and send them to your Blue Cross and Blue Shield Plans. It is necessary throughout the year to keep good records, and to retain all receipts, making sure that they indicate the patient's name, description of service rendered, date of service, and the charges. Timely filing, about every three months as bills come in, is also important for optimum claims processing.

Examples of Major Medical services which are picked up where your Blue Cross and Blue Shield coverage leaves off are: doctors' home and office visits; blood; covered prescription drugs and insulin; private duty nursing (when medically necessary, as determined by Plan physician review); local ambulance service; X-ray and diagnostic laboratory procedures; anesthetics; services beyond the 120-day Blue Cross and Blue Shield maximum for hospital care; services of a qualified professional physiotherapist; prosthetic appliances, rental of an iron lung or other durable equipment; and radiation therapy.

Once the Covered Medical Expenses exceed \$5,000 for a participant's medical needs during a calendar year, the program will provide 100% payment for any additional covered expenses during the remainder of that year. Every participant has a \$100,000 benefit lifetime maximum.

In order to get maximum use of the Major Medical benefits which are available to you, it's important that you read the employee booklet which is provided through the Commonwealth program. Remember that itemized bills for services and receipts for prescriptions must be included with your claim. When filling out forms, take extra care to be sure all boxes are checked and all necessary information is included. Also, submit claims within 12 months following the



end of the year in which you receive medical services. If you require any assistance in filing claims, or need additional claim forms, contact the Blue Cross and Blue Shield Plans or Mrs. Elizabeth Welch, Personnel Office.

FELLOWSHIPS, GRANTS, ETC.

Deadline: Mar. 15 National Institute of Correction/Grants for training, research and evaluation, policy, technical assistance in four areas: staff development, field services, jails, and screening for risk. 202/724-3106.

No Deadline: Business and Professional Women's Foundation/Women's Scholarship Program. Three scholarship programs are available (averaging \$450 per woman). (1) Career Advancement Scholarships--for women over 25 who need further training or education to begin a career or to improve professional opportunities, and for women who are returning to graduate, undergraduate or vocational school after a break in their education (2) Clairol Loving Care Scholarships--for women over 30 years of age for full- or part-time study in vocational schools, undergraduate college degree programs, or graduate work at the masters or professional level. (3) A new scholarship opportunity being introduced this year is the Florence Morse Scholarship Program for women who are at least 25 years of age and enrolled in business

Deadline: Jun 1 NEH/Fellowships for independent study and research. For scholars and teachers of the humanities who have shown promise of making a significant contribution to humanistic knowledge. Applicants must have completed their professional training (presumably this means the Ph.D.) but may otherwise be at any stage of their careers (degree candidates are not eligible). Those eligible for the Summer Seminars or Fellowships in Residence for College Teachers should probably apply for them rather than the Fellowships under discussion here. Six or twelve months; maximum stipend \$20,000.
