#### Faculty Exchange Program

In its continuing effort to have additional qualified members of minority races on its faculty, the College will be exploring the possibility of instituting a faculty exchange program for 1 year periods with Hampton Institute, Norfolk State University, Virginia State University or other predominantly Black institutions. Faculty members who are interested in participating in such an exchange program should notify the Vice President for Academic Affairs.

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#### Use of State Vehicles

Faculty and Staff who use State Pool Cars may obtain gasoline in any one of several ways. If while using a car you become aware that you need fuel, pull into a State Highway facility and use the "green" State credit card (in the plastic pocket located on the passenger side of the front seat). If you are unable to locate a State Highway facility, stop at any gas station and use the "white" State credit card also in the plastic pocket. If you are unable to do either of the above, buy the gasoline with "cash" (be sure to ask for receipt) and include it on your request for reimbursement or you may send the receipt with a letter to the State Motor Pool and ask for reimbursement from the Comptroller. The last procedure will mean that the charge will be to the State Motor Pool and not your department. Finally, maintenance personnel will fuel all State Pool cars at 7:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M. daily if the vehicles are parked within the maintenance compound at the time. Therefore, to assist the next person who uses the car, and to avoid some of the emergency procedures above, please return the cars to maintenance area when you have finished with them. If the gate is locked simply park the car in front of the gate or at the curb adjacent to the gate.

Jay Paul delivered a paper entitled "The American Poet's Confrontation with Nazi Violence" at the Virginia Humanities Conference. He was elected Delegate-at-Large, which means he will be involved in planning future conferences.

Alice Randall presented a paper, "Reading History," based on her planning research and experience in teaching the CNC Basic Studies course for students enrolled in History 101, at the national Spring Conference sponsored by the University Counseling Services of VPI on April 2. The paper has been published in the Conference Proceedings.

On April 14, <u>Dean Algin B. King</u>, School of Business and Economics, served as a consultant to the <u>Peninsula Planning District Commission</u>. He spoke to a group of city planners and managers in the Newport News/Hampton SMSA. That evening he spoke to the
