## CNU Captains

*Ranked  
in Top 15 Nationally*

The men's basketball team enters the last month of the regular season with a 14-3 overall record and a 5-1 Dixie Conference mark. CNU was ranked 11th in the National Association of Basketball Coaches poll on January 18. The Captains are ranked #1 in the South Region.

In February, the men's team has two home games left. On February 7, they face Ferrum College, the only team to defeat CNU in the Conference. On February 10, Homecoming 1996 will be celebrated with a doubleheader against Averett College at 7:30 p.m. Both games will be preceded by a women's game at 5:30 p.m.

The women's team has won seven games in a row, including a big 76-72 win at Ferrum on January 19 to raise their record to 10-7 overall and 6-0 in the Dixie.

## To: All Departments From: Purchasing Office

The Air Travel Card contract (formerly called Universal Air Travel Plan or UATP), was issued by the Division of Purchases and Supply for use by all departments, agencies and institutions. Use of this charge card as the only payment method for airline tickets became mandatory effective January 1, 1992.

Recently, several agencies have been granted an exception to this policy on a case by case basis so that they could purchase airline tickets on ValuJet Airlines. ValuJet is a so-called "start-up" airline that has been operating for about two years. They currently serve 26 airports, including Newport News, Virginia. Their fares are significantly lower than other scheduled air-
