

Sociobiology and Great Books Panels

In the weeks to follow the Sub-Committee of the Dean's Colloquia will be sponsoring two panels, one which will discuss Sociobiology and the other to debate the question of civil disobedience. The Sociobiology panel will air a number of questions related to that topic as a potential new discipline. The second panel will inaugurate an ongoing series of debates on major questions emerging from the Great Books collection. Each panel will organize its debate around a collection of readings to be placed on reserve in the Library. All those interested in attending are invited to read or familiarize themselves with the readings. Each panel member will present statements of their positions on the debated questions. In each session the audience will be asked to participate through questions and comments. Faculty members who have suggestions for future Great Books or contemporary, controversial panel topics should submit them to Tim Morgan. Suggestions ought to include the topic, some selected readings, and

some names for the panel. Details about the first two panels will appear in next week's Chronicle.
