The revised Tuition Waiver Policy for CNC employees will become effective beginning with registration for classes fall semester 1990. The policy is provided below:

TUITION WAIVER POLICY FOR EMPLOYEES

Consonant with Christopher Newport College's commitment to the continued professional and personal development of members of the faculty and staff, a policy to permit employees to pursue on-campus courses of instruction (degree and non-degree credit) offered by the College without the payment of tuition and fees has been approved by the Board of Visitors.

Approval of courses taken under this policy is subject to the following stipulations:

- This program provides that all full-time classified, 1. instructional, administrative and professional faculty, approved by the appropriate Vice President and President, may receive waiver of tuition for one (1) course, four (4) credit hours or less, during each regular semester, and one (1) course, four (4) credit hours or less, during For administrative faculty, entire summer. professional faculty and classified employees, courses taken under this policy may only be taken outside the individual's assigned workday. For most employees that workday is 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., but the policy also applies to employees whose regular work schedule is other than 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. For instructional faculty, courses may only be taken outside hours scheduled for teaching, advising and office hours. This policy covers both job-related and non-job-related courses. employee terminates his/her employment during the semester in which (s)he is enrolled, or is terminated for other than the convenience of the College, (s)he will be responsible for all financial obligations incurred, including fees and tuition. If outstanding financial obligations are not met, a final grade will not be recorded in the Registrar's Office and employee's final paycheck may be adjusted if money is owed to the College.
 - Special programs, including private vocal or instrumental instruction, and public service non-credit course, are not authorized under this policy.




