Automated Ways to Use

You can easily use your Credit Union from your home or office almost 24 hours a day.

Virginia Credit Union

With QuikLine audio response you can handle your own transfers, requests for savings withdrawals by check, and inquiries about your accounts. This is a FREE service that is available almost 24 hours a day. This service has a special toll free telephone line. Simply call and request that your QuikLine personal identification number and easy operating instructions be mailed to you.

With a Virginia Credit Union automated teller machine (ATM) card you can withdraw up to \$200 a day at locations convenient to your home or office. This service is available through The Exchange and The Relay ATM networks. Relay ATMs are in Virginia, North Carolina, and South Carolina, and are most widely found at Sovran Banks that display the Cashflow sign. The Exchange ATMs are found across the country. A Virginia Credit Union ATM is located in the DMV lobby at 2300 West Broad Street in Richmond.

To make using your Credit Union even more convenient, you can have all or part of your paycheck automatically deposited to one or more of your credit union accounts through payroll deduction.
