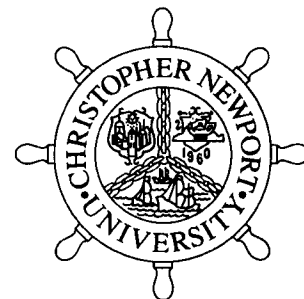

**MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE PLANNING COUNCIL**  
January 20, 1995


The Executive Planning Council (EPC) held its fifth meeting at 1:15 p.m., Friday, January 20, 1995, in the office of the Vice President for Student Services. Members present were: Mr. William Brauer, Vice President for Administration and Finance; Dr. Robert Doane, Faculty Senate President; Dr. David Harner, Vice President for Development; Mr. Keith McLoughland, Interim Vice President for Student Services; Mrs. Cynthia Perry, Associate Vice President for Institutional Effectiveness; and Dr. Richard Summerville, Provost (presiding). Also present was Dr. Dorothy Doolittle, Executive Assistant to the President.

The Council discussed the implementation of the University's restructuring plan which was approved by SCHEV on January 10, 1995. It was noted that numerous parts of the plan are already having an effect upon various University activities, including class scheduling, admissions, and *Catalogue* preparation. It was agreed that while the Council was not charged with direct oversight of the plan's implementation, Council members who had such oversight responsibility would report at future meetings on progress that was being made within their respective jurisdictions. The provost reported that the final version of the restructuring plan will be mass produced and given wide distribution on campus. Copies will be provided to all offices and to all members of the teaching/research and administrative/professional faculties.

The Council discussed the creation of an *ad hoc* committee on strategic planning by the Board of Visitors and the relationship of this body to the planning process defined by the President on August 11, 1994. The *ad hoc* committee is scheduled to have its first meeting on January 27, 1995. Representatives of the Council will meet with the President prior to that meeting to discuss mechanisms for coordinating the ongoing (internal) work of the planning process with the work of the new Board committee.

Mrs. Perry advised the Council that binders containing all materials submitted by the various colleges and departments in support of the production of the next iteration of the University's strategic plan will be distributed to all members of both EPC and BACUP on January 23, 1995. In the near future, EPC must take strong steps to produce the next version of the strategic plan from these materials and the approved restructuring document. Once the new planning process has completed its first full cycle, the strategic plan will be updated and approved by the Board of Visitors in June of even-numbered years; so the planning document now being developed will be effective only through June, 1996. However, it must form the basis for operating budget allocations for the second year of the present biennium and for both operating and capital submissions for consideration by the 1996 session of the General Assembly. Inasmuch as these submissions are due in the summer of 1995, the production of the plan has now assumed a substantial order of urgency. The Council hopes to be able to present a draft of the plan to the Board of Visitors at its March meeting and to present the final document for approval at the June meeting of the Board. EPC will meet again on Tuesday, January 31, 1995 to address the logistics and timetable for this process.

The meeting adjourned at 2:30 p.m.
