Registration

The Fall 1991 Registration News will announce that regular registration will be extended from the normal two days to seven and one half weeks prior to the beginning of classes.

This does not change the usual opportunity for currently enrolled students to take advantage of early registration scheduled to begin April 8 to April 11, 1991. New freshmen will continue to register during the summer following freshman orientation as they always have.

The new extended registration is intended for all other students, including new, transfer, readmitted, etc.

Students will be able to apply for admission to the college, make an appointment with an adviser, and present their registration form to the office of the Registrar between July 1, 1991 and Aug. 21, 1991 during the hours of 9 a.m. - 4 p.m., and Wed. evenings from 5 until 6:30.



The Admission and advising procedure is the same as in past years, but now the student will not have to wait for the formerly scheduled two days of registration.
