The Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education (FIPSE) has announced their Fiscal Year 1991 LECTURES PROGRAM. This program provides for grants of up to \$5,000 for the development of lectures about General Education in Science, The Articulation of Secondary and Postsecondary Education, International Education, and Incentives for Teaching. Deadline for application is March 1, 1990. Application package is now available in the Grants Office.

The National Science Foundation program guidelines for <u>Career Access Opportunities in Science and Technology</u> are available in the Grants Office. This program is structured to provide funding for <u>Comprehensive Regional Centers For Minorities</u>, and <u>Model Projects for Women, Minorities and Persons with Disabilities</u>. Closing date for proposals is January 31, 1991.

The US Department of Education, Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services has announced funding priorities and issued Invitation for Applications for Fiscal Year 1992. A variety of research and demonstration projects related to disabilities and rehabilitation will be funded. The full text of the notice for this program is contained in the December 4, 1990, FEDERAL REGISTER, pages 50084 to 50114. This document is available in the Periodicals Room of the Captain John Smith Library.

The National Science Foundation has published a program solicitation for Private Sector Partnerships to Improve Science and Mathematics Education. Funding of this program is very broad in scope, but requires the active participation of the private sector. Closing date for proposals is February 15 and August 15, 1991. The full text of the program announcement can be made available to anyone interested in pursuing an application.

The American Association for the Advancement of Science and the Environmental Protection Agency have announced Environmental Science & Engineering Fellowships for the summer of 1991. Applications must be submitted by March 1, 1991. Fellows will spend ten weeks at EPA headquarters in Washington, DC. (TGA DEC 90)

The Educational Testing Service has announced the <u>Visiting Scholar Program</u>, <u>Postdoctoral Fellowship Program</u>, and <u>Summer Graduate Research Program</u>. The Visiting Scholar and Postdoctoral Fellowship <u>Programs provide</u> for fellowships for eleven months beginning in September 1991. Applications are due by February 1, 1991. The Summer Graduate Research program provides funding for eight weeks in the summer of 1991. Applications are due March 1, 1991. (TGA DEC 90)

The Environmental Protection Agency has announced research grants available for Identification and Evaluation of Biological

Indicators of Terrestrial Ecosystem Stress. \$1,000,000 will be awarded for approximately 10 projects. Applications are due by March 15, 1991. (TGA DEC 90)

The General Service Foundation has announced Research and Demonstration Grants in International Peace, Population, and Resources. Letters of inquiry are accepted any time. Invited proposals must be submitted by March 1 or September 1. (TGA DEC 90)

The John D. and Catherine T. MaCarthur Foundation has announced the availability of research and environmentally related activities supported through the <u>World Environment and Resources Program</u>. Applications are accepted any time. (TGA DEC 90)

The National Endowment for the Humanities has announced a program for <u>Summer Seminars for College Teachers - 1991</u>. Applications must be submitted by March 1, 1991. Fifty one seminars will be offered in 1991. Twelve participants are selected to attend each of the seminars. Stipends of up to \$3,750 are provided for program participation. (TGA DEC 90)

The United States Congress Office of Technology Assessment has announced the OTA Congressional Fellowship Program for 1991-1992.
